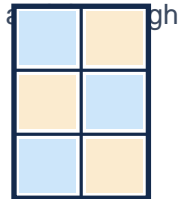
Window Cost-Per-Window Worksheet

Estimate your project honestly: count your windows, pick styles and glass, and apply realistic per-window ranges.

■ Step 1 — Count your windows

Walk the house room by room and write down how many windows you want to replace, and the size of each (standard, large, or oversized).

Most homes have 8-12 windows. The count is the single biggest driver of the total.



■ Step 2 — Choose a style per opening

Double-hung is the common all-rounder. Casement seals tightest. Sliding is budget-friendly. Picture is a fixed view. Bay and bow add space.

■ Step 3 — Apply per-window ranges (installed)

Double-hung: \$450-\$900 each.

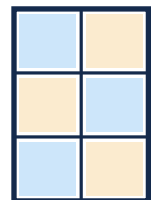
Casement: \$550-\$1,100 each.

Sliding: \$400-\$850 each.

Picture (fixed): \$400-\$1,200 each.

Bay or bow: \$1,500-\$4,500 each.

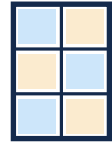
Impact / storm: \$700-\$1,600 each.



■ Step 4 — Add it up

Multiply each style's count by its range to get a low and high estimate. A whole-house project often lands between \$8,000 and \$25,000+.

These are estimates, not quotes. Get the real number from licensed installers.

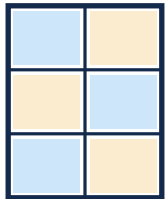

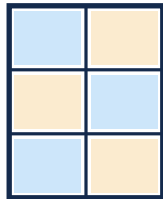

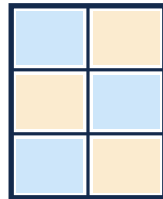
Window styles at a glance



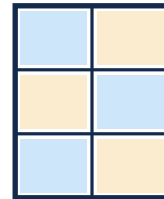
Double-hung
